

We Support One Another

Ephesians 4:1-7, 11-16

Preacher Bobby reminded us of this a few weeks ago during a sermon, "No one is an island." No one can ultimately survive or thrive without the assistance of others, especially the church.

In the 21st Century, the "me" driven society focuses on "what will benefit me or my family" and rarely is thought given to how our actions and choices impact other people. Our sinful nature is drawn to selfishness. However, when we come to Christ, we are immediately joined with all believers.

Today's lesson addresses our responsibility toward others. Paul doesn't tell us to create unity but to keep the unity. We are given two ways to do this.

- 1. God empowers us to pursue relational unity. In humility, we should consider others in addition to ourselves. With gentleness and through patience, we should show others the same mercy we have been shown from Jesus.
- 2. God empowers us to profess doctrinal unity. There is only one Savior, Jesus Christ.

Don't approach church for how it will benefit you, but how we as the church might benefit one another. Let's use our spiritual gifts to grow, unify, and love Christ's church.

Accepting Discipline

Proverbs 29:1-3, 12-20

Discipline is essential for spiritual growth and development. God uses discipline from society, family, and others to shape His people. When the righteous walk in God's wisdom, everyone benefits.

Our spiritual journey as believers takes a similar path but it does not automatically make us mature Christians. We will inevitably make mistakes in our spiritual training. When we do, God uses discipline to correct us and get us back on track.

Today's lesson gives us words of wisdom that encourage believers to understand and accept the value of discipline.

Proverbs 29:18-20 reminds us that words alone do not constitute wisdom as acting on those words is required.

God's wisdom is available to everyone.

God's revealed truth must be put into action.

God's Word provides a basis for determining wise action.
